Nikolas Kekel: I am a public historian working at the Marietta History Center as an assistant and the University of West Georgia as a Graduate Research Assistant. I am studying for my master's in history with a focus on public history at UWG. During my time as a historian, I have worked on multiple exhibits and digital projects, which have helped inform my work for Princess Vlei Forum. I was originally attracted to public history because of the way it connects people of different backgrounds. Schools help educate students, but historic sites and museums present the opportunity to engage with a wider audience. To me, Princess Vlei embodies this aspect of public history; it has many stakeholders from a variety of backgrounds who will all benefit from the work being done by the Forum.

Sam Harris: I am a museum educator at the Booth Western Art Museum and a public historian with a background in military history and K-12 museum programming and education. I am currently earning my master's in history with a public history focus. During my time at the University of West Georgia, I have become proficient in public history applications such as ArcGIS, Omeka Digital Collections, and Weebly. I am currently developing programs for all levels of Scouts at the Booth Museum for the purpose of boosting public engagement and creating lasting connections with both the Boy Scouts of America and the Girl Scouts of the United States of America.

Sarah Craig: I am an emerging public historian with a background in mass communications, public relations, and public history. I am currently earning my master's in history with a focus on public history and museum studies. During my time as a graduate student, I have worked with the National Park Service in conjunction with The Antonio J. Waring Jr. Archeological Laboratory to catalog and rehouse artifacts associated with the Ninety Six National Historic Site. As a public historian, I strive to make history accessible to everyone.

Sheridan Kearns: I am relatively new to the field of public history. I am a Graduate Research Assistant at the University of West Georgia Center for Public History. My interests include Ancient History as well as Early American History, which I will get to explore at the internship I was awarded at Thomas Jefferson's Monticello. While I pride myself on being a traditional historian, I am looking forward to continuing to use my skills to pursue my concentration in public history for my master's degree. It has been a pleasure to work on the Princess Vlei project this term, as I have gotten to experience new cultures and learn how to help a historic site further their vision of bridging the divide between communities.

Digital Team Goals

When speaking with Denisha and her team, the needs which stood out were the need for a way to organize their existing stories and a way to collect additional stories. As part of this, they wanted to build a digital database which would help them organize their collection. They were also intrigued by the possibility of using this database to build digital exhibitions, allowing them to reach a larger audience than those who can only visit Princess Vlei in person. One of the concerns they voiced surrounding this was the potential cost, manpower, and how they could equitably handle the competing voices found at Princess Vlei. If possible, they also wanted this new database to be integrated into their existing website and infrastructure or be easy for users to navigate from one to another. Part of the motivation for the revitalization of the Vlei surrounding the 2014 Imagine campaign was the desire to protect the land both for its environmental significance and its incredible cultural significance. The proposed database is an extension of this desire to protect the Vlei, this time to protect the stories of the people who visit. In 2014 the activists at the Forum started reclaiming the Vlei's space, now comes the equally difficult work of reclaiming the narrative of the Vlei. This database will support this effort by preserving these stories and giving them a platform from which to share them. After hearing these desires and concerns, our team's goal over the course of this project has been to create an implementation plan which the Princess Vlei Forum can use to select an appropriate platform which meets their needs. To address this, we have created a list of platforms, their pros, cons, cost, and what level of training they require. We also wanted to provide the forum with resources which would assist them in creating their database after they selected a platform. We have included lists of support documents broken down by platform as part of this. In addition, we have provided an example grant proposal to be utilized to help with the concerns about funding. With the COVID pandemic, many foundations and organizations have recognized the need for more digital

initiatives and are funding more and more of these types of projects. We have also looked at how other cultural sites and museums in the area use their website and created a reference document to show the kinds of features they may wish to include in their own database or digital exhibition. Part of our goal was to address how stories can be collected and shared at Princess Vlei. Given the other concerns surrounding cost and equitable access, we have included a suggestion which focuses on the human element of these stories.

Database Options

Evaluating Platforms

Before selecting a platform, it is essential to decide what the database is meant to achieve; all of these platforms have their strengths and weaknesses. All of them are able to organize artifacts and records into a usable form. However, some have features which make sharing stories with the community more accessible. These additional features increase the overhead both financially and in terms of time staff will need to dedicate to managing it. Deciding what is most important for the Princess Vlei Forum will help narrow down the selection of platforms

Descriptions of Database Platform Options

Omeka:

Omeka is a platform which specializes in digital collections and online exhibitions. It is a very versatile platform that can be customized to the needs of the Princess Vlei Forum. This can be done through the use of plugins, and more significant changes can be made by those who have experience in coding. As well as being a powerful stand-alone platform, sites built with Omeka could be integrated with the existing site in such a way that guests would have a smooth transition from one to another. The major attractive qualities of this platform are the wide range of pricing, ranging from free to R15,500.00, along with pre-made plans if selected custom pricing options can be arranged. The limitations of this site include the inability to host videos directly. However, videos hosted on other platforms can be cataloged and viewed through Omeka. While unique and highly polished websites can be produced with Omeka, it requires more effort than template-based platforms such as Wix or Squarespace.

PastPerfect:

PastPerfect is a platform which focuses on collection management and cataloging. It was designed by museum professionals to help organize extensive collections and allows access to

your collection database from anywhere with an internet connection. PastPerfect excels at helping new or existing museums and historic sites manage their collection and turn it into a usable resource. Major drawbacks to this platform include the price and the lack of public-facing features. Pricing begins at R5,510.00 for setup with an annual fee of R14,700.00 and goes up to R18,300.00 for setup with a yearly fee of R55,100.00. This platform also lacks public-facing features and is mainly designed for internal use, with online functionality used for ease of access. In order to create digital exhibitions, PastPerfect would require the use of an additional platform.

ArchiveSpace:

ArchiveSpace is similar to PastPerfect in that it is primarily designed for organizing and managing collections rather than digital exhibitions. For this intended purpose, ArchiveSpace is a valuable tool which would help keep the proposed collections organized and usable for researchers. The public-facing options which ArchiveSpaces has are more designed for creating finding aids which could be used by researchers rather than digital exhibitions that the general public could use. Additional negative aspects of this platform include the pricing structure based on the institution's size. The Princess Vlei Forum would likely fall into the R4,500.00 to R14,700.00 range. Regardless, this is just an estimate as all users must submit an application to determine the final cost. Hosting services are not included in this price and would need to be purchased separately or utilizing the Forums existing infrastructure.

CollectionBuilder:

CollectionBuilder is a free open source program which can be used to create versatile custom digital archive sites. Unlike other platforms, this option does not come with any support and would require a third party to design and build the website. Instead, staff could spend some time learning the platform and how to build with it, but this would require a sizable investment in training. After which, it could be integrated with the existing hosting services, or additional

hosting services could be added. The major draw of this platform is the price; with no annual fee, once the setup is complete, there would be no additional cost. However, any updates or changes to functionality would require the Princess Vlei Forum to make those changes themselves. The drawback to this platform is the extreme complexity compared to the turnkey solutions offered by other options.

Collective Access:

Similar to CollectionBuilder, Collective Access is a set of free, open-source tools which can be used to create a database and public-facing exhibition site. Also, like CollectionBuilder, this would require someone from the Princess Vlei Forum or a third party to learn the platform and build the site and maintain it. Hosting services are not included with this platform and would need to be sourced locally.

CatalogIt:

CatalogIt is similar to Omeka in that it is both a digital collections management tool and an online publishing platform. CatalogIt offers web publishing to all levels above the free trial version, with the main difference between levels being the amount of storage available. CatalogIt is also a robust organization tool that helps keep collections orderly and usable. Pricing begins with a free trial version and can go up to R11,760.00 annually. Custom plans are also available depending on an institution's needs. The major draw of this platform is the ease of use and the flexible pricing. However, the digital exhibitions made with CatalogIt are templated, so they all have a very similar appearance. This is both a good and a bad thing; the template makes creating an exhibition easy but limits customization.

Vimeo & Youtube:

All of these platforms are mostly designed for hosting metadata and images, with some being able to hold audio as well. They are not intended to host video as video is a far more resource-

intensive medium and would quickly eat through bandwidth. Instead, the metadata for videos can be kept within the database of choice, with the actual video file being hosted by another platform. For the platforms with a public-facing component like Omeka, videos can be embedded in exhibition pages so that viewers do not need to leave the main website.

The primary differences between Vimeo and YouTube are the prices and video streaming quality. Youtube is free, but the videos stored there are very compressed compared to the original filmed quality. Once uploaded, the video is compressed, and this process is not reversible. Vimeo stores videos at a much higher quality which is closer to the native file, however, their hosting services are very expensive depending on the amount of bandwidth needed. They start out free for only 0.5GB weekly and go up to R13,225.00 annually for unlimited streaming. Despite this claim of unlimited streaming, Vimeo has been known to charge surge pricing if their systems get overloaded and there is no way to predict if or when this might occur. This cost would also be on top of the main platform's fees. For this reason, YouTube is recommended despite the lower quality video. Higher quality versions of video could be stored on-site on physical media if access to uncompressed versions of videos was desired for research purposes. A NAS, or network-attached storage, is a type of server which acts as storage for computers on the same network. They can also be configured so that one is able to access them remotely from anywhere. If the Princess Vlei Forum wanted to store high-quality video files for future use, they could build one of these systems at a relatively low cost compared to the annual fee taken by hosting services like Vimeo.

Story Collection:

Part of the function of this database will be to house stories which are shared at the Princess Vlei Forum. The collection of these stories poses a technical challenge as none of these platforms support user-submitted content. There are also safety concerns over sharing unmoderated stories

as this could cause strife between various groups which visit the Forum. In order to solve these issues while also keeping in mind how expensive web design can be, we suggest a more low-tech solution. The Forum can have a dedicated email address where interested users can share their stories with staff. These emails can then be imported into the existing database platform; once a sufficient amount of stories have been collected, a digital exhibition can be created from these entries in the database. This method is very manual and requires someone to be responsible for reviewing the stories submitted. However, this human element ensures that these stories are presented in the best possible light. A fully automated system would not be able to sort out any inflammatory remarks, especially given the multilingual nature of the Forum. Many automated moderation systems struggle with languages other than English, which is another reason the manual review is recommended. For those without easy access to email, the physical cards with their stories can be collected from the Heritage Center and entered into the database as an artifact and featured alongside those stories which are submitted digitally.

A digital archive can support events, such as the Princess Vlei cairn ceremony above, by providing a repository for the stories shared during the proceedings. Photos of these events also represent digital artifacts which can be used to tell additional stories as part of digital exhibitions.

Database Support Options

Each platform has its pros and cons for support for the majority of cases though there is a decent amount of options from both the platform provider and third parties. What follows is a brief description of the support options for each platform and a list of links which may be helpful when setting up your database. Some options such as CollectionBuilder and Collective Access require the user to create a large part of the site themselves. While the support listed would be helpful in doing this they may require the employment of a third-party developer if staff time and training can not be dedicated to the site. Other options like Omeka and CatalogIt still require user input, but provide a much more robust template to start with and are similar to website builders like Wix or Weebly.

PastPerfect

The PastPerfect support features a series of user guides, video tutorials, a user manual for both the local and web-hosted versions, along with training courses that can be purchased. As well as first-party support being such a popular program, PastPerfect features a large number of third-party tutorials forums.

YouTube & Vimeo

YouTube is one of the most popular streaming platforms, as such many guides and tutorials are available for uploading and saving videos. The more complicated piece would be embedding these videos into the main platform. Platforms focusing on digital exhibitions, such as Omeka, feature guides on how to embed videos into your site. Other platforms like PastPerfect which are not as public-facing do not have support for this kind of feature.

Vimeo is not as popular as YouTube, however many guides still exist for uploading videos to the site. Linking these videos back to the main platform may be more difficult due to Vimeo's smaller adoption rate.

A digital archive would also help to preserve the heritage of the First Nations peoples such as the Khoe. Their stories through written and oral histories could be stored in the database along with images of important cultural items. Along with digital exhibitions, this would give them a platform for continued activism. The Forum currently includes a large number of their stories; a database would help organize these stories as they continue to grow.

Example Grant Proposal

Funding is a major concern for any museum or historic site; this is why looking for grants from outside organizations can be of critical importance. Projects such as implementing a digital database can be funded by partner organizations who specifically look for these types of projects to fund, with digital programs recently receiving increased priority due to the pandemic. Executive Summary

The Princess Vlei Forum is requesting a grant of \$1,000 to develop a digital database during [Insert Calendar Year] to provide a space for digital records with online access available to the Capetown community. Currently, the online database and digital records on the Princess Vlei Forum website include a limited online research database. This database has been successful at the Princess Vlei Forum; however, the need for equitable, accessible virtual record-keeping for the Capetown community has grown due to the lasting effects of the Apartheid Era. Creating a larger audience will open doors to communities in different areas of Capetown who haven't visited the Princess Vlei Forum before and will yield the potential for more community partnerships, visitors, and volunteers. The expansion and increase of a digital database and records will also provide the Princess Vlei Forum with the opportunity to create another venue that will be available for community members to participate and learn about the Forum. A digital database will allow community members to learn and explore history in an engaging way and provide equitable access to Princess Vlei Forum resources. The creation of a digital space for community members will provide a platform for growth, discussion, and exploration of new ideas, which is critical to the Princess Vlei Forum's mission and vision to "Bridge the Divide."

As digital platforms continue to develop as an integral part of our world, communities need to connect and engage with their history in new ways that will carry Capetown forward with growth, changes, and insights that will become future history.

Evaluation

The main measurement will be online visitations to the Princess Vlei Forum digital database Omeka site and oral history gathering events, plus an overall increase in user traffic on the main page of the Princess Vlei Forum website. Community feedback will be important for staff members who maintain the Princess Vlei Forum's digital database. It will also be important to survey community members to determine if they feel their community is accurately and equitably represented in the digital database.

Critical to the continued expansion and growth of the Princess Vlei Forum digital database will be how receptive community members are to the Princess Vlei Forum offering an online-accessible database that hosts community historical records, which are diverse, inclusive, and interactive.

If the Princess Vlei Forum digital database does not draw attraction from a diverse community as an educational resource, then the Princess Vlei Forum will need to determine if this is an achievable objective in [Insert Calendar Year].
